NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Town of Cinco Bayou will have the following offices on the ballot for the March 12, 2019, Municipal Election:

TOWN COUNCIL, THREE SEATS: for a three (3) year term each

Candidates must be qualified electors and residents of the Town of Cinco Bayou. They are elected at large, by highest number of votes.

The qualifying period shall commence at noon on Monday, December 31, 2018, and shall close at noon on Friday, January 4, 2019.
